

ANSWERS WITH EXPLANATION

1. Answer:

(a) Both A and R are correct and R is the correct explanation of A

Explanation:

The assertion about the UIP's goal to vaccinate millions annually is correct and reflects the program's scope and objective. The reason provided, regarding the use of digital technologies like U-WIN to track vaccinations, directly explains and supports how these technologies enhance the UIP's effectiveness by ensuring better data management and real-time tracking, making the vaccination process more efficient and systematic.

2. Answer:

(b) 2 and 3 only

Explanation:

The International Court of Justice (ICJ) indeed declared that Israel's occupation violates international law, which is a correct statement. Also, the ICJ's opinions are advisory and hold significant moral and political weight but are not legally binding on countries, making statement 3 correct. However, statement 1 is incorrect because ICJ's opinions are not legally enforceable, which means they do not bind the countries to comply strictly.

3. Answer:

(B) Only two statements

Explanation:

Statements 1 and 3 are correct. The fault in Microsoft's Azure did impact global businesses, including sectors like aviation and banking in India, and the Indian government's Ministry of Electronics and IT did coordinate the response to the disruption. However, statement 2 is incorrect because CrowdStrike's software update was indeed implicated in the disruption, playing a crucial role.

4. Answer:

(a) Both A and R are correct and R is the correct explanation of A Explanation:

The assertion that female employment rates are crucial to addressing rising unemployment in India is accurate, reflecting the potential impact of increased labor force participation. The reason given, that increased female participation can lead to economic growth and stability, directly explains why focusing on female employment is beneficial, not only increasing the workforce but also enhancing economic stability through diversity and inclusion.

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5. Answer:

(C) Only 2 and 3

Explanation:

Statement 2 is incorrect because relying heavily on historical data without updating with real-time changes can lead to inaccuracies in monsoon predictions. Statement 3 is also incorrect; the assertion that IMD's forecasting technology has high precision might be overstated considering the ongoing challenges and inaccuracies in predicting monsoon patterns. However, statement 1 is correct; inadequate data from neighboring countries does indeed contribute to inefficacy in monsoon predictions.

6. Answer:

(a) 1 only

Explanation:

Al algorithms have been successfully developed to predict rogue waves up to five minutes in advance using ocean buoy data, making statement 1 correct. However, statement 2 is incorrect as no Al model has yet demonstrated a prediction accuracy of nearly 100% for such complex natural phenomena, reflecting the ongoing challenges and limitations in predictive technology.

7. Answer:

(B) Only two statements

Explanation:

Statements 1 and 2 are correct: CoWIN was crucial during the COVID-19 vaccine rollout, and e-Vin has been used to manage vaccine logistics. However, statement 3 is incorrect; U-Win is designed for immunization registry and tracking, not for distributing electronic gadgets.

8. Answer:

(a) 1 and 3 only

Explanation:

Statements 1 and 3 are correct. The Digital Health ID is indeed part of the U-Win portal, aiming to improve healthcare efficiency through better data management. However, statement 2 is incorrect because the Digital Health ID is intended for broader health record management, not exclusively for COVID-19 vaccination records.

9. Answer:

(a) 1 and 3 only

Explanation:

Statement 1 is accurate as the Finance Commission indeed recommends the revenue-sharing model between the Centre and the States. Statement 3 is also correct; Arvind Panagariya leads the 16th Finance Commission. However, statement 2 is incorrect; the recommendations by the Finance Commission are advisory and not binding on the government.

10. Answer:(B) Only two statementsExplanation:

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Statement 2 is correct; the draft National Menstrual Hygiene Policy was introduced in 2023. Statement 3 is also correct as it recognizes all individuals who menstruate, including transgender and intersex people. Statement 1 is incorrect; the Supreme Court of India has not approved the inclusion of menstrual leave under the Maternity Benefits Act.

11. Answer:

(C) Only 2 and 3 Explanation: Statement 1 is correct; the PIL does argue that climate change impacts should be included in Environmental Impact Assessments (EIA). Statement 3 is also correct; G. Sundarrajan filed the PIL. However, statement 2 is incorrect; the Madras High Court did not dismiss the PIL citing jurisdiction issues but instead asked the Centre to respond, acknowledging the plea's validity.

12. Answer:

(a) 2 and 3 only Explanation: India maintains a policy of strategic autonomy, as indicated in statement 2, which allows it to navigate complex international relationships independently. Statement 3 is also correct, with the U.S. expressing concerns about India's oil purchases from Russia amid the conflict. However, statement 1 is incorrect as India has not unequivocally condemned Russia's actions in Ukraine, reflecting its balanced diplomatic stance.

13. Answer:

(B) Only two statements Explanation: Statement 1 is correct as CIMMYT played a significant role in developing high-yielding maize varieties, contributing to the Green Revolution in maize. Statement 3 is also correct; India's maize output has indeed more than tripled since 1999-2000. However, statement 2 is incorrect; while maize is used for ethanol production, it is not the primary use of maize in India, with most maize going towards feedstock.

14. Answer:

(b) Both A and R are correct but R is not the correct explanation of A Explanation: Both the assertion and the reason are correct; the gig economy does offer flexibility, and the Karnataka draft Bill seeks to provide protections and transparency. However, the reason does not directly explain the assertion as it addresses regulatory aspects, not the inherent flexibility of gig work.


15. Answer:

(C) Only 2 and 3 Explanation: Statements 2 and 3 are incorrect. The additional deaths expected from climate change are not primarily due to infectious diseases like cholera and tuberculosis, but rather from a wider range of causes including heat stress, malnutrition, and malaria. Statement 1 is correct as the WHO has indeed projected additional deaths annually due to climate change impacts.

16. Answer:

(C) All three statements Explanation: All statements are correct. The BNSS extends police custody beyond 15 days with possible judicial oversight, aims to replace the CrPC, and has been criticized for potential increases in custodial violence, reflecting broader concerns about human rights and the legal process.

17. Answer:



(A) Only 1 and 3 Explanation: Statements 1 and 3 are incorrect. IAS officers on probation can indeed face severe repercussions for fraudulent behavior, but they are not allowed to engage in overt political activities during probation. Statement 2 is correct; probation usually lasts two years and can be extended based on performance evaluations.

18. Answer:

(a) 1 and 2 only Explanation: Statements 1 and 2 are correct. The Finance Commission indeed recommends how taxes should be shared between the Centre and States and aims to enhance funding for local bodies.
However, statement 3 is incorrect; cesses and surcharges collected by the Centre are generally not shared with States, which has been a point of contention in state-central financial relations.

19. Answer:

(b) 1 and 3 only Explanation: Statement 2 is incorrect as the private sector's enthusiasm is limited due to perceived market risks and financial uncertainties, which deter investment in infrastructure despite significant allocations by the government. Statements 1 and 3 correctly reflect the budget's allocation and the encouragement for states to invest in infrastructure.

20. Answer:

(c) A is correct, R is incorrect Explanation: While it is true that India is aiming to involve one crore farmers in natural farming, the reason provided is incorrect. Natural farming can potentially reduce yields, especially when transitioning from conventional to natural methods, thus posing risks to food security rather than enhancing it.

21. Answer:

(a) 1 only Explanation: Statement 1 correctly reflects the budget's initiative towards alleviating the financial challenges faced by MSMEs. Statements 2 and 3 are incorrect as there were no specific increases in direct tax provisions for MSMEs mentioned in the budget, nor was a new scheme for technological upgrades explicitly introduced.

22. Answer:

(c) Only 2 and 3 Explanation: Statements 2 and 3 are incorrect. Customs duties were reduced in the budget, not increased, and the fiscal deficit target for the budget year was set at 4.9% of GDP, not 4.5%. Statement 1 is correct, reflecting the budget's shift in incentives from production-linked to employment-linked.

23. Answer:

(a) 1 only. Explanation: Statement 1 is correct as rising sea temperatures contribute to more frequent and intense hurricanes. Statement 2 is incorrect as the intensity of hurricanes, including Category 5 storms, has actually increased, not decreased, due to climate change.

24. Answer:

(c) A is correct, R is incorrect Explanation: The assertion that Paris 2024 aims to be the greenest Olympic Games ever is correct, focusing on halving carbon emissions and using sustainable practices. However, the

reason provided is incorrect as the games plan to use a mix of renewable sources, not exclusively nonrenewable sources.

25. Answer:

(b) Only two Statements Explanation: Statements 1 and 3 are correct as the budget included an increase in the standard deduction and aims to phase out exemptions and deductions under the new tax regime. However, Statement 2 is incorrect because there was no reduction in capital gains taxes; in fact, adjustments were aimed at increasing them in some cases.

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
