- 1. Answer: (a) Both A and R are true, and R is the correct explanation of A Explanation: Increased urbanization typically results in the replacement of vegetative surfaces with concrete and asphalt. These materials have higher thermal mass and absorb more heat during the day and radiate it during the night, leading to higher temperatures in urban areas compared to rural areas. This phenomenon is known as the urban heat island effect, thus R correctly explains A.
- 2. Answer: (a) 1 and 2 only Explanation: The discovery by JWST of an unexpectedly large and bright galaxy dating back to 290 million years after the Big Bang does indeed suggest that galaxies formed sooner after the Big Bang than previously thought and challenges our understanding of dark matter's influence on early galaxy formation. However, statement 3 is too strong as current models require modification rather than complete revision.

However, the discovery that non-coding DNA regions, such as certain enhancers, have a significant impact on disease mechanisms challenges this view and highlights the complexity of genetic contributions to diseases like IBD.

They rely on a representative sample of voters and their disclosed voting preferences to make early predictions, which is why the reason correctly explains the assertion.
- 7. **Answer: (b) Explanation:** India's strategy to become a developed nation by 2047 involves maintaining a high growth rate and investing in modern sectors like renewable energy and technology. However, the strategy does not involve reducing reliance on manufacturing; rather, it emphasizes boosting manufacturing to create jobs and promote industrial growth, making statement 3 incorrect.
- 8. **Answer: (a) Explanation:** Delhi's water crisis during summers is largely due to the city's water treatment infrastructure, which, while operational at full capacity, fails to meet the heightened demand. This seasonal peak in demand leads to shortages, exemplifying how infrastructure inadequacies directly contribute to the crisis, hence the reason explains the assertion perfectly.
- 9. Answer: (a) Explanation: Reverse transcriptase is crucial in integrating viral DNA into the host genome, which has been a pivotal discovery for understanding retroviral infections and designing targeted therapies for diseases like HIV. However, while it has led to advances in cancer research, it is not used directly in chemotherapy treatments, which typically involve cytotoxic drugs that kill cancer cells, making statement 3 incorrect.
- 10. **Answer: (a) Explanation:** The presence of 'green-beard' genes in social amoebas supports the concept of genetic mechanisms driving altruistic behavior, where these genes enable amoebas to recognize and preferentially cooperate with kin. This genetic basis for altruism aligns with evolutionary theories that suggest altruistic behavior can evolve if it benefits genetically similar individuals.

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- 16. **Answer: (a) Explanation:** The discovery of reverse transcriptase revolutionized the understanding of how genetic information can be transferred from RNA to DNA, challenging the previously accepted central dogma which stated that genetic information flows only from DNA to RNA to protein. This enzyme has also facilitated the development of gene editing technologies by improving our understanding of genetic mechanisms. The role of reverse transcriptase in gene therapy and other biotechnological applications underscores its significance beyond its original discovery context, supporting both statements 1 and 3.
- 17. **Answer: (a) Explanation:** Green spaces in urban areas contribute significantly to reducing the urban heat island effect. This cooling is primarily achieved through the process of transpiration, where plants and trees release water vapor into the air, which absorbs heat during its evaporation. This not only cools the surrounding air but also improves overall urban microclimates. The reason provided directly explains why increased green spaces can lead to a measurable reduction in urban temperatures, thus supporting the assertion.
- 18. **Answer: (c) Explanation:** In the context of Delhi's water crisis during summers, factors like increased agricultural water demand upstream and lower than average rainfall significantly exacerbate water shortages. However, reduced industrial water usage would typically conserve water rather than worsen the crisis. In fact, less industrial demand could potentially alleviate some pressure on urban water supplies, making it an incorrect factor in the context of exacerbating Delhi's water crisis.
- 19. **Answer: (d) Explanation:** The European Parliament elections significantly impact EU governance but do not determine the President of the European Commission directly; that role is influenced more broadly by the political outcomes of the election. MEPs must indeed avoid holding dual roles in both national governments and the European Parliament, ensuring their duties are focused solely on EU matters. The statement about consistently increasing voter turnout since 1979 is incorrect, as voter turnout has varied, with some elections seeing lower participation than others.
- 20. **Answer: (a) Explanation:** Technological advancements in the field of oncology, particularly through the introduction of liquid biopsies, have significantly reduced the need for invasive diagnostic procedures. Liquid biopsies allow for the detection and analysis of cancer markers through simple blood tests, providing a non-invasive alternative to surgical biopsies. This capability not only minimizes patient discomfort but also expedites the diagnostic process, thus enabling earlier and potentially more effective interventions. The reason precisely explains the assertion, highlighting how modern technology facilitates improved cancer diagnostics and patient care.
- 21. **(a)** Both Assertion and Reason are correct, and Reason is the correct explanation of Assertion. The complexity of overlapping health regulations in India complicates compliance, especially for smaller healthcare providers. These regulations often set unrealistic standards which are difficult to meet, particularly by government facilities. The private sector faces stringent enforcement, suggesting a disparity that needs addressing for equitable healthcare quality and compliance.
- 22. **(C)** All three statements are correct. NEET-UG 2024 faced controversy due to an unusually high number of top scorers, allegations of a paper leak, and rapid result declaration, raising suspicions about the examination's integrity. The National Testing Agency defended the process, despite the controversies, which highlights ongoing challenges in administering such high-stakes examinations transparently.

This approach aims to ensure that policies are not only effective but also equitable across different regions and economic contexts.

The question of holding general elections in Jammu and Kashmir amidst recent terrorist attacks adds to the complexity of maintaining democratic processes in conflict zones. These conditions underscore the importance of robust security measures to ensure the safe conduct of elections, reflecting the ongoing security challenges in the region.
